


SOCIAL PRACTICES AND DYNAMIC NON-HUMANS

As titled above, this book, edited by Cecily Maller and Yolande Strengers, and published by Palgrave Macmillan, contains research papers presented at the 'Animals, Automated Devices and Ecosystems' symposium, which convened in Barcelona in October 2015.

The title of this book uses non-humans as a term of the vast array of actants and agents (e.g. animals, plants, bacteria, robots) that are enrolled in, and affect change across what we understand as a society. The book is divided into two main parts:

Part I is related to nature, materiality, and processes; featuring contributions from 7 researchers exploring practices that involve living, organic, or life-like nonhumans, and their social practices and effects on the world.

Part II is concerned with the social practice and dynamics of technology, automation, and performativity; in the form of robots, automated devices, and software. This book is from Derasat's Library collection, and is available for borrowing with a valid library card.

THE IMPACT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC REPORT
